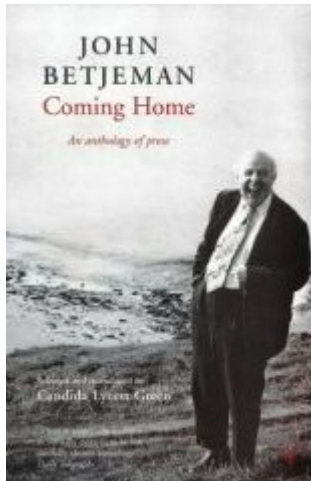

Share your favourite Betjeman lines, enjoy his unique combination of comic writing, eccentricity and Englishness which has led him to be a much-loved figure.

Teacher, journalist, broadcaster, Poet Laureate and devotee to the preservation of England's architectural heritage.

Betjeman was probably the most widely-read English poet of the twentieth century. When Betjeman's Collected Poems came out in 1958 they made publishing history.

Born on the 28th August 1906 into a middle class family in Hampstead he was schooled at Byron House and Highgate School, where he was taught by the poet T. S. Eliot. Later he boarded at the Dragon School preparatory and Marlborough College, attended Oxford University and Magdalen College. Failing his degree in Oxford did not hold Betjeman back, his skill in writing and his passion for architecture provided Betjeman with a career and proved him to be one of the most influential poets of any century. A great achievement for a man who once described himself in Who's Who as a "poet and hack" Ending his career Poet Laureate and as much-loved figure on British television, somewhere in Betjeman's work there will be a line, a thought, an ideal that will hold you, enthrall you.
